

IMMC Summer Camp Bathroom Independence Policy

Children must be potty independent to attend IMMC Summer Camp.

What is bathroom independence?

Being potty independent means a child can communicate the need to go to the bathroom and complete the entire process on his or her own. While staff supervise multiple group bathroom breaks during this program, they are not able to facilitate bathroom visits for children.

Bathroom independence includes being dressed in cloth underwear without frequent daily accidents. IMMC Museum staff are not equipped to assist children with potty training. If your child has frequent accidents, we will reevaluate whether your child is ready for our program.

Children must...

1. Recognize the need to use the restroom on his or her own (Adults are not prompting them to go).
2. Be able to pull their pants up and down on their own and wipe and clean themselves.
